Resolution Approving an Application for North Carolina Division of Water Infrastructure Grant Funding Available through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 for the Sprague Neighborhood Park Sewer Rehabilitation Project

Summary of Information:

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 has authorized the distribution of grants to aid eligible units of government in financing necessary investments in water and wastewater infrastructure. The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Division of Water Infrastructure (DWI) will administer these funds through the State Fiscal Recovery Fund appropriated in the state budget for drinking water, wastewater, and stormwater projects.

The Sprague Neighborhood Sewer Rehabilitation project was initiated after the Sprague neighborhood was identified as an area needing extensive sewer rehabilitation based on the condition assessment performed as part of the Collection System Improvement Program. The scope of work for this project includes the construction of gravity sewer rehabilitation that consists of open-cut pipe replacement, open-cut point repairs, cured-in-place pipe, pipe bursting, replacement or rehabilitation of service laterals, restoration of ground and roadway surfaces, and traffic control. The budget for this project is \$5,000,000 and included in the City of Winston-Salem Capital Improvements Program budget.
