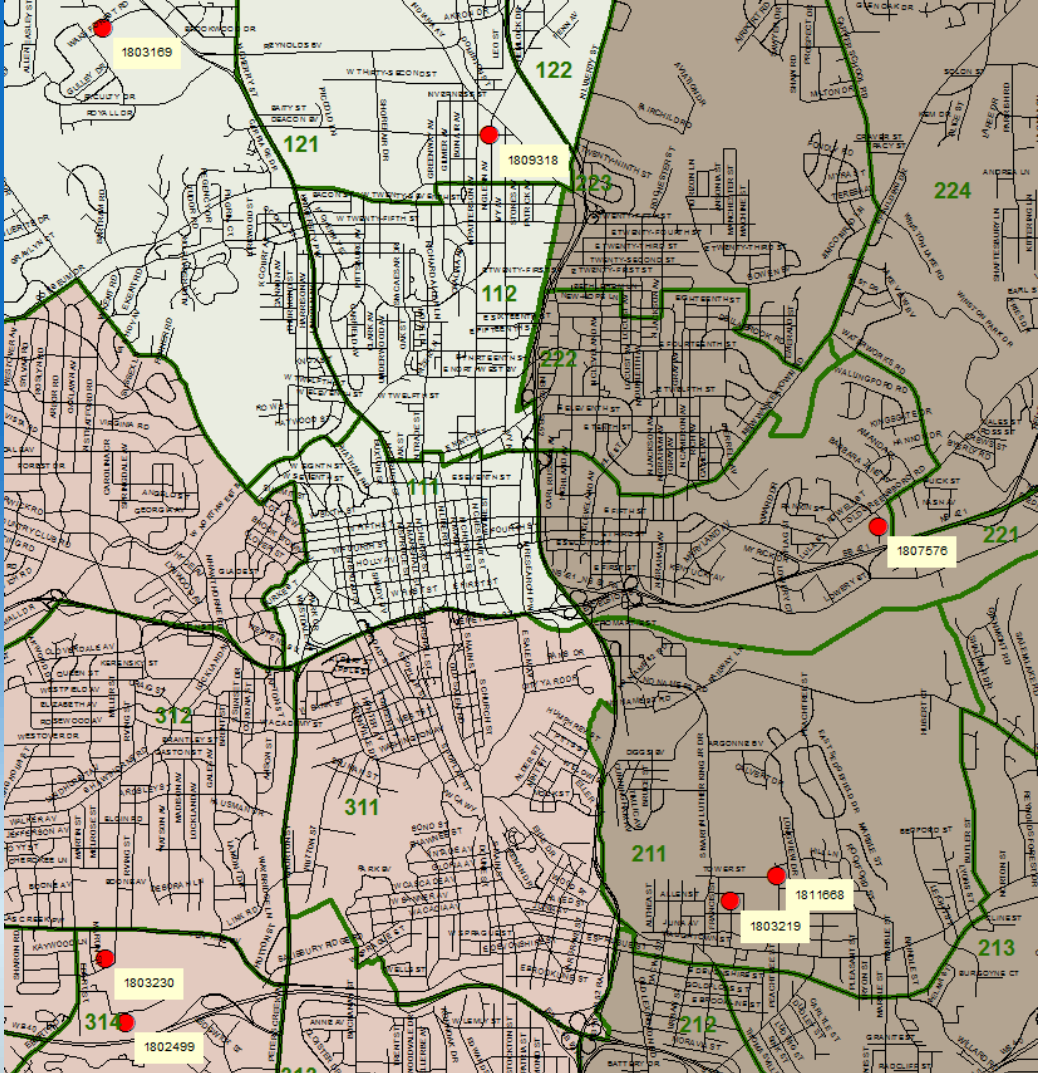

Chronic Violent Offender

Chronic Violent Offender (CVO) is a local strategy designed by the Forsyth County District Attorney's Office to provide a comprehensive review for all Chronic Violent Offenders within Forsyth County.

The strategy includes partners from federal, state, and local agencies with jurisdiction within Forsyth County. The partnership meets monthly to review CVO cases involving Chronic Repeat Offenders, including cases where firearms are seized as evidence of crimes and firearm related evidence (i.e. shell casings, projectiles, etc.). There is an additional Chronic Violent Offender meeting every other month that focuses on gang related crimes.

The partnership reviews these cases to determine 1) the best venue for prosecution – state charges, federal charges, or both, 2) required follow-up by local law enforcement agencies to provide better prosecution on the case, 3) identify and provide needed training for local law enforcement and/or prosecution partners, and 4) identify and implement procedural or policy changes needed within agencies

A Culture of Transparency and Accountability

- ◆ The City of Winston-Salem established a Citizen Police Review Board in 1993 as a way to have additional oversight of the police complaint process
- ◆ WSPD utilizes a monthly Public Safety News Conference, Twitter, Instagram, Police Newsletter, and Crimemapping/P2C to get information to the public
- ◆ WSPD adopted a Body Worn Camera program beginning with a pilot program in 2011 and the decision was made in September 2013 to fully implement throughout the patrol division and other special units
