G-1. Resolution Authorizing a 10-Month Extension for the Driver Restoration Initiative and Vocational Expansion (DRIVE) Program in Forsyth County, North Carolina.

Johnnie Taylor, Assistant City Manager, provided the staff report for this item.

Council Member Larson stated his support for this program and requested to hear comments from the Assistant District Attorney's Office.

Elizabeth Dresel, Assistant District Attorney, stated the biggest impact of this program is helping citizens restore their driver's license. She noted the court system has suffered some closures because of COVID as well as personnel issues, which has impeded the number of participates for this program. She stated currently there are 300 applications pending which shows there is an interest in this program.

Macey Wiseman, Legal Assistant, DRIVE Program, stated people are still applying to the program noting that they have received 40 more applications since last week.

In response to Mayor Pro Tem Adams, Scott Tesh, Budget and Performance Management Director, stated he would check to see if ARPA funds could be used to help fund this program.

Mayor Pro Tempore Adams asked that the District Attorney's Office present the Mayor and City Council a report on how the City could help with this program.

Council Member Burke and Council Member Mundy noted their support for this program.
