The company has an existing facility in the Southeast and is seeking expansion to support its growing North American market. In addition to the potential development of a greenfield site Winston-Salem, the company is considering the purchase of a competitor in the Midwest. Project Beaver is seeking financial assistance to reduce its capital outlay associated with the new facility, which would create 28 new jobs at an average wage of \$47,321. Taxable capital investment is expected to total \$31 million over the first five years of the project (\$12 million in real property and \$19 million in machinery and equipment). A representative sample of jobs at the new facility includes machinery operators, warehouse staff, maintenance workers, and administrative staff. **Committee Action: Committee Action** For Against **Remarks:**

The attached resolution authorizes the City to provide up to \$291,183 in performance based economic development assistance to Project Beaver. The City's assistance is based upon an amount equal to 50% of the net, new property taxes expected to be generated over its first five years.

If approved, the first annual incentive payment would be made on or about July 1 following the first full year's property tax payment by the company for the facility, machinery, equipment, and business personal property. Subsequent payments would be made annually thereafter on or about July 1.

North Carolina General Statute 158-7.1 authorizes cities to make appropriations for economic development purposes. The project is consistent with the City's public policy justification to stimulate the local economy through the creation of new jobs and investment. Forsyth County and the State of North Carolina are also considering financial incentives.

If approved by the Finance Committee, a public hearing would be held at the City Council meeting on April 21.
