Ordinance Amending Chapter 26 Section 6 of the City Code Related to Exemptions to Curbside Collection

**Summary of Information:**

The Sanitation Division currently services an estimated 81,589 households within the city limits. There are 3,525 households that are exempt from curbside collection. Backyard collections makeup 4.3% of the division’s total collections, in comparison to peer cities whose curbside exemptions make up less than 1% of total collections. Currently, once an address is added to the exemption list, it remains there indefinitely unless staff is notified by a resident that the service is no longer needed. This includes instances where a home is rented to multiple tenants over a period of time or when the exemption was only needed temporarily.

The attached amendment makes changes to Section 26-6 (e) of the City Ordinance to include supplementary information to qualify for backyard collection service. (1) A doctor’s statement to verify that the resident nor anyone residing at their address can take the roll out cart to the curb. (2) A recertification of their exemption status every three years. These prerequisites will ensure that the intent of the program remains intact, while also decreasing the number of potential injuries and minimizing the amount of hazardous materials in which our frontline employees are exposed to.
