SUBJECT: Demolitions for March 9, 2026
Community Development/Housing/General Government Committee Meeting

Historic Resources staff has reviewed the three (3) properties that are scheduled to go before the Community Development/Housing/General Government Committee on March 9, 2026, for demolition consideration. Per the list provided by Neighborhood Services, the proposed demolition is:

1. 633 Mulberry Street – South Ward – Contributing in the West Salem Historic District Listed on the National Register of Historic Places in
2. 1135 Argonne Boulevard – Southeast Ward
3. 1405 North Jackson Avenue – Northeast Ward

None of the buildings are locally designed as a Local Historic Landmark are located within a locally zoned historic or historic overlay district. However, 633 Mulberry Street is located within the West Salem Historic District that is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

If demolition for this structure is approved, Historic Resources staff requests that the Community Development Department have the structures professionally photo-documented and submit the photos to the Forsyth County Historic Resources Commission.
