RESOLUTION AWARDING A PURCHASE ORDER FOR BREATHING APPARATUS AIR COMPRESSOR

WHEREAS, the Winston-Salem Fire Department needs a Breathing Apparatus Air Compressor at Fire Station No. 3; and

WHEREAS, the NPPGov's Intergovernment Agreement, cooperative purchasing group, entered in to a MPA Agreement per RFP No. 1920 for Fire Fighter Self Contained Breathing Apparatus Compressors between the League of Oregon Cities and Bauer Compressors, Inc. via authorized dealer, Sub-Aquatics, Inc. d/b/a Safe Air Systems of Randleman, NC as per order #SO-NC15016 for the compressor system at a cost of \$178,132.29; and

WHEREAS, N.C.G.S. 143-129(e)(3) authorizes "purchases made through a competitive bidding group purchasing program, which is a formally organized program that offers competitively obtained purchasing products and services at discount prices to two or more public agencies"; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Finance Committee that a purchase order be awarded to Sub-Aquatics, Inc. d/b/a Safe Air Systems, per the NPPGov's Intergovernment Agreement, cooperative purchasing group, for the purchase of a Breathing Apparatus Air Compressor at a cost of \$178,132.29.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, that a purchase order is hereby awarded to Sub-Aquatics, Inc. d/b/a Safe Air Systems, per the NPPGov's Intergovernment Agreement, cooperative purchasing group, for a Breathing Apparatus Air Compressor at a cost of \$178,132.29. This recommendation is in accordance with N.C.G.S. 143-129(e)(3), and that the proposal, bid specifications, and the City's purchase order will constitute the contract.
