Summary of Information:

In February 2021, the Office of State Budget and Management (OBSM) established a special fund for new capital improvement projects and repair and renovations for State Agencies and the University of North Carolina. The City of Winston-Salem Recreation and Parks received \$900,000 for capital improvements for various projects.

In December 2021, the City Manager approved the execution of a professional services contract with Jordan Consultants, ASLA, P.A. in the amount of \$19,500 for professional landscape architectural design services of Helen Nichols Park improvements, which provided a preliminary design layout walking trail/path, located within the park and adjacent to Carl H. Russell, Sr. Community Center.

In June 2022, City Council approved \$1,000,000 of Limited Obligation Bonds for improvements to expand the walking track at Helen Nichols Park. The scope of work includes, but is not limited to, a walking trail/path, senior fitness equipment and a shade structure. The services of a professional architect and engineer are needed to provide design and construction oversight for the construction of this project.

The consultant has provided the City of Winston-Salem with a fee proposal of \$82,600. The current contract amount is \$19,500, the change order is \$82,600. The new total contract amount is \$102,100.

The consultant has agreed to the City's MWBE Participation goals. Funding to accommodate this change order was approved by City Council on June 21, 2022.
