Resolution Awarding Purchase Order for One Fire Pumper Truck

## **Summary of Information:**

Winston-Salem Fire Department has the need to purchase one fire pumper truck. The new truck will replace truck #1503, a 2003 Spartan/Quality pumper with 151,345 miles and has amounted \$171,937 of repair and maintenance costs over its life. On December 1, 2017, Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC) received bids for fire service apparatus and The Sutphen Corporation, located in Dublin, Ohio, has been awarded competitive bid contract #FS12-17 product code DDC04 specifications for this equipment and offers the Sutphen Heavy Duty Monarch fire pumper truck per HGAC specifications, including the performance bond, at a cost of \$626,782.34.

N.C.G.S. 143-129(e)(3) authorizes "purchases made through a competitive bidding group purchasing program, which is a formally organized program that offers competitively obtained purchasing products and services at discount prices to two or more public agencies."

It is recommended that a purchase order be awarded to The Sutphen Corporation for the purchase of one Sutphen Heavy Duty Monarch fire pumper truck per bid contract #FS12-17 product code DDC04 specifications including the performance bond for the total award amount of \$626,782.34. This recommendation is in accordance with N.C.G.S. 143-129(e)(3).

The City's FY 2019-20 capital equipment budget includes \$627,000 for this purchase which will be financed through the North Carolina Municipal Leasing Corporation. Funding for the lease payments is available in the General Fund FY 2019-20 budget.
