Approval of an Ordinance Amending Section 42-177 of the City Code Relating to Nonresidential Parking in Residential Areas

Summary of Information:

The City Council adopted a Residential Permit Parking Zone Policy April 3, 1978, in an effort to enhance the quality of life in residential areas by preserving the safety of children and other pedestrians, reducing unwanted noise and reducing litter.

The City Council approved a change to the Residential Permit Zone Policy January 26, 2009 to allow for a one-time waiver of the parking eligibility studies for the neighborhoods surrounding the baseball stadium. Property owners along any given street within a neighborhood, may petition the City for inclusion in the residential permit parking zone by submitting a petition of two-thirds of the property owners along a street.

The Condo Associations for West End Village submitted a petition in 2009 and was included in the residential permit zone for a section of Green Street and Holly Avenue.

The City has now received a request from the West End Station Apartments to extend the Residential Permit zone to include the portion of Green Street and Brookstown Avenue adjacent to their development. The Department of Transportation recommends approval of the request.
