natural disasters combined; and

WHEREAS: Fire causes over \$14 billion in annual property loss in the United States,

including \$4.3 million in Winston-Salem during 2016; and

WHEREAS: The Winston-Salem Fire Department responded to 341 building fires in

2016; and

WHEREAS: the proliferation of synthetic furnishings in the modern fire environment has

reduced the time to escape a residential fire to less than four minutes; and

WHEREAS: Fire Prevention Week is observed during the Sunday through Saturday

period in which October 9th falls, coinciding with the anniversary of the

Great Chicago Fire of 1871; and

WHEREAS: the 2017 Fire Prevention Week theme is "Every Second Counts: Plan 2

Ways Out!"; and

WHEREAS: The Winston-Salem Fire Department conducts more than 500 fire

prevention programs annually, but is particularly focused on fire prevention

during the entire month of October.
