## **Summary of Information:**

Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 160D-1119 and Section 10-36.1(a) of the City Code, the building located at 1415/1417/1419 N. Liberty Street, also known as Parcel ID: 6836-52-4580.000, was declared unsafe by the Building Inspector. Notice of the unsafe building declaration and an administrative hearing was mailed to the owner of record on August 19, 2022.

On September 6, 2022, the City and the property owner entered into a Consent Order. All parties agreed that the building (i) constitutes a fire or safety hazard; (ii) is dangerous to life, health or other property; (iii) is likely to cause or contribute to blight, disease, vagrancy or danger to children; or (iv) is considered by the City to have a tendency to attract persons intent on criminal activities or other activities that would constitute a public nuisance. All parties further agreed that the building at 1415/1417/1419 N. Liberty Street would be demolished and removed by the property owner on or before November 28, 2022.

Remarks:				

All required notices have been served and the time granted for compliance has expired. The owner has not complied with the Consent Order to repair or demolish the building. Pursuant to Section 10-36.9 of the City Code, City Council shall hold a hearing to determine if the building in question is in such a dilapidated or substandard state of disrepair as to constitute a fire or safety hazard, or to be dangerous to life, health or other property, or is a public nuisance, and if the owner of the building has failed or refused to abate the nuisance and remove the hazards found to exist. Upon such finding, City Council may cause the demolition and removal of the building and specially assess the cost of such work against the lot or parcel of land. Pursuant to Section 10-36.7 of the City Code, this item and the attached report of the Building Inspector shall be placed on the January 3, 2023 agenda of the City Council.
