**Informational Briefing** 





- Update on Complete Count Committee efforts was presented to CD/H/GG Committee on January 8, 2020.
- At that time, community outreach efforts were planned or underway with billboards, wraps on sanitation trucks, local radio ads, social media, and planned "Get Out The Count" events.
- The Coronavirus halted not only many of our efforts, but Census Bureau efforts as well.
- Public-facing Census Bureau Operations were suspended in mid-March, including events, physical counts, and group quarters enumerations.
- The Winston-Salem location of the Area Census Office (ACO) also closed in mid-March.

- New Developments in 2020 Census response:
  - Self-response window has been extended to October 31, 2020.
  - Census Bureau public facing operations resumed June 1, 2020,
    with some non-contact outreach starting late May 2020.
  - Group quarters enumerations are in the process of being rescheduled.
  - Winston-Salem ACO resumed partial operations late May 2020, with full operations anticipated in early June 2020.
  - Enumerators have begun reaching out to some households in a 'contactless' manner, leaving information and questionnaires on doorsteps in anticipation of resuming door-to-door operations.

- New Developments in 2020 Census response:
  - Council authorized \$50,000 in Febrary 2020 to be spent on local Census outreach.
  - Initial expenditures included billboards, sanitation truck wraps, media buys and printing, with additional funding planned for "Get Out the Count" events.
  - It is hoped that with the extension of the self-response window, these planned events will be able to occur, with social distancing, in the late summer or early fall.
  - An additional \$10,000 was awarded through a grant from the National League of Cities to be used for outreach to the historically undercounted Census tracts in Winston-Salem.




## Winston-Salem/Forsyth County 2020 Census Response Rate


- For the 2020 Census, the Census Bureau has an online Response Rate Tracker.
