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**RESOLUTION AWARDING CONTRACT FOR QUARRY PRODUCTS**

**WHEREAS**, after due advertisement, bids were received and publicly opened by the City/County Purchasing Department at 10:30 a.m. on July 14, 2022, for the purchase of quarry products during the period from the August 2022 award through July 31, 2023, with the option to extend the contract for as many as four additional twelve-month periods, subject to agreement by both parties and funds being available for this purpose; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the recommendation of the Finance Committee that a contract be awarded for the purchase of quarry products during the period from the August 2022 award through July 31, 2023 with the option to extend the contract for as many as four (4) additional twelve month periods, subject to agreement by both parties and funds being available for this purpose to Vulcan Construction Materials, LP, the low bidder, in the estimated annual amount of \$563,295.00.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, that the contract for the purchase of quarry products during the period from the August 2022 award through July 31, 2023 with the option to extend the contract for as many as four (4) additional twelve month periods, subject to agreement by both parties and funds being available for this purpose, is hereby awarded to Vulcan Construction Materials, LP, in the estimated annual amount of \$563,295.00 and that the City Manager and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the contract on behalf of the City, contract forms to be approved by the City Attorney.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the award of this contract constitutes a preliminary determination as to the qualifications of the bidder. The City is not legally bound to perform the contract until the contract is duly executed by the City.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that funds have been appropriated in the FY 2022–23 budget and will be available in various operating accounts to cover the cost of this contract. Additional funding to cover future costs of any contract extensions is subject to future budget appropriations.
