**WHEREAS**, the City of Winston-Salem joins cities and counties across the United States in a nationwide celebration of Historic Preservation Month, and;

**WHEREAS**, historic preservation is an effective tool for economic development, tourism promotion, revitalizing neighborhoods, fostering local pride, and maintaining community character while enhancing livability; and

**WHEREAS**, Historic Preservation Month is sponsored by the Forsyth County Historic Resources Commission, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Historic Resources Commission's mission is to protect and enrich the City and County's cultural, historical, architectural, and archaeological heritage through the identification, designation, and preservation of historic resources, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Historic Resources Commission strives to promote the use and conservation of historic properties for the education, pleasure, and enrichment of the residents of Winston-Salem and Forsyth County, and;
