Summary of Information:

Pursuant to Section 78-49 of the Winston-Salem City Code, all Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity expire on December 31 following the third full calendar year after their issuance. The City Council may renew the certificate in the absence of any contrary evidence and upon the finding of the Public Safety Committee that the certificate holder has the ability to comply with the provisions of the City's Vehicle for Hire Ordinance.

Remarks:

Triad Transportation, Inc. has applied for a renewal of a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the operation of thirty limousines in the City of Winston-Salem. The certificate was originally issued on February 7, 2005 to Mr. Herman H. Mazzeo, D.B.A. Fly P.T.I. Transportation. Mr. Herman H. Mazzeo was also the owner of Triad Transportation, Inc., which was formed in July 2007. Mr. Herman H. Mazzeo has since passed on August 17, 2017 and the company is currently owned by a trust that was set up before his passing. Christopher S. Youmans is currently the executor of the estate for Mr. Herman H. Mazzeo, the trustee of the Herman H. Mazzeo Trust of 2014, and Triad Transportation, Inc. a North Carolina Corporation. There have been no other changes since January 20, 2015.

The Department of Transportation recommends renewal and transfer of certificate to Triad Transportation, Inc. pending the company's compliance with all City Codes, licenses, permits and zoning requirements. If approved, the City will have 206 authorized taxicabs, 140 authorized limousines and 4 horse-drawn carriages.
