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**RESOLUTION AWARDING CONTRACT FOR .NET DEVELOPER SERVICES**

**WHEREAS**, City/County Purchasing issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) on behalf of the Winston-Salem Information Systems Department to provide .NET Developer Services, with proposals received on March 11, 2022, from the following firms: The Evolvers Group located in Flower Mound TX, Info America Inc. located in Cary, NC, Lancesoft located in Herndon, VA, Miracle Software Systems, Inc. located in Novi, MI, MSys, Inc. located in Washington, DC, RadGov, Inc. located in South Plainfield, NJ and T-Worx, Inc. located in Boca Raton, FL; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposals from The Evolvers Group, InfoAmerica, Inc., Lancesoft, Miracle Software Systems, Inc., MSys Inc. and T-Worx, Inc. failed to include signature authorizations or other documents that were designated as required in the original request for proposals and as a result, these proposals were rejected as non-responsive; and

**WHEREAS**, terms of the RFP specified detailed evaluation criteria of M/WBE commitment, business location, cost effectiveness/price value and experience/education and an evaluation panel of staff members from Information Systems, Finance, and the Office of Business Advancement and Inclusion reviewed the proposals received and are recommending award to RadGov, Inc. in the total contract amount of \$73,000; and

**WHEREAS**, terms of the bid specify the right for the City to extend this contract up to three additional six-month periods, if both parties agree and funds are made available for that purpose, for a potential total estimated contract value of \$292,000; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, upon recommendation of the Finance Committee, that the City Manager is

hereby authorized to execute a contract with RadGov, Inc. in the contract amount not to exceed \$73,000.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the award of this purchase order constitutes a preliminary determination as to the qualification of the bidder. The City is not legally bound to perform the contract until the order is duly executed by the City.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that funds have been appropriated in the FY 2021-22 budget to cover the cost of this contract.
