Summary of Information

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307 funds are appropriated to urban areas with more than 200,000 in population and are used for operating and capital assistance.

The Winston-Salem Urban area has received a full appropriation of the FTA FY 2026 Section 5307 Formula funding in the amount of \$7,042,301. The city of Winston-Salem is the designated recipient of this funding for the Winston-Salem Urban Area. At the May 2026 Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting, the Winston-Salem Area TAC approved the 2026 apportionment to the three eligible sub-recipients and for Job Access and Reverse Commute (JARC) agencies for funding: the Winston-Salem Transit Authority (WSTA) receives \$6,025,150, the Piedmont Authority for Regional Transportation (PART) receives \$688,948, Davidson County Transportation receives \$272,505, and JARC agencies receive \$55,000.

As a direct recipient of FTA funding, Davidson County Transportation is eligible to apply directly to FTA for its portion of the Section 5307 funds if the City of Winston-Salem issues a sub-allocation or split letter so that they can apply to receive these funds.
