## **Summary of Information:**

The City of Winston-Salem has received a petition to close and abandon a portion of Baity Street, Silas Street, and W 32<sup>nd</sup> Street. These closings will be part of the Baity Street Development. The areas petitioned for closure are:

- 1. The portion of Baity Street approximately 450 feet east of University Parkway; the area is approximately 1,170 feet in length and contains 1.167 acres. It is bounded on the north by Tax PINs 6826-78-8555, 6826-88-0585, 6826-88-3565, 6826-88-5555, 6826-88-8515, on the east by Tax PIN 6826-98-4490, and on the south by Tax PINs 6826-88-8387, 6826-88-7338, 6826-88-6351, 6826-88-5361, 6826-88-4341, 6826-88-2391, 6826-88-1318, 6826-78-9352, and 6826-78-8342.
- 2. An unopened right-of-way off Reynolds Boulevard, 163.17 feet in length and contains 0.187 acres. It is bounded on the west by Tax PIN 6826-69-9975, on the east by Tax PIN 6826-79-9879, and on the south by Tax PIN 6826-79-2428.
- 3. The portion of W 32<sup>nd</sup> Street approximately 850 feet west of Shorefair Drive; the area is approximately 600 feet in length and contains 0.635 acres. It is bounded on the north and west by Tax PIN 6826-89-5270, and on the south by Tax PIN 6826-99-5047.
