Summary of Information

BACKGROUND:

In 2024 the North Carolina Realtors Association released the *Carolina Core Housing Study*. This report summarized the state of housing within a 150-mile-wide area in central NC containing 21 counties. In conjunction with the Triad Real Estate and Builders Industry Council (TREBIC), they have asked local jurisdictions to step-up with plans to address this housing shortage.

Over the past several years, the City of Winston-Salem has also recognized the housing deficit affecting our community and undertaken several steps to address housing needs. The City has identified the need for additional housing options in the last two comprehensive plans: *Legacy 2030 Update*, adopted in 2012, and *Forward 2045*, adopted last year. As part of the implementation of *Legacy 2030 Update*, multiple text amendments were adopted that relate to various aspects of housing development.



Vision: To be a premier city in the region providing world-class amenities while retaining a sense of charm and hospitality **Mission:** To provide impactful services that enhance the quality of life for current and future generations

Values: Teamwork * Responsibility * Respect * Integrity * Customer Service

Staff in both the Housing Department and Planning and Development Services will be working on a number of initiatives over the next several years aimed at expanding housing choice.

Recommendation:

To address the request presented by TREBIC and the Realtors Association, the City and County have an opportunity to partner on the establishment of a housing goal for Winston-Salem/Forsyth County. This goal can be used as a strategic benchmark and show the community's commitment to housing at multiple price points and types to appeal to the housing needs of current and future residents.
