b) Consideration of a resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the Creative Corridors Coalition to provide matching funds for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Drive Streetscape Enhancement Project.	
Summary of Information:	
The adopted Capital Plan for 2014-2019 provides funding to enhance the appearance of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Drive corridor between Trade Street and the Winston-Salem State University campus. The total estimated cost of the streetscape enhancements is \$3,125,000. Eighty percent (\$2,500,000) will be paid with Federal Surface Transportation Program – Direct Attributable (STP-DA) funds. The required 20% local match will be shared between the City and the Creative Corridors Coalition (CCC) – 10% or \$312,500 each.	
Attached is a resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) for these streetscape enhancements. The agreement will provide \$2,500,000 in STP-DA funds and will require the City to provide 20% matching funds for the project. The NCDOT agreement can only be between the City and the NCDOT.

Also attached is a resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the CCC that provides for the CCC to contribute 10% of the matching funds for the project, estimated at \$312,500.

Funding for this project was appropriated as part of the 2014-2019 Capital Plan; therefore, a budget amendment is not necessary.

City staff will arrange an updated presentation on the enhancements project at the August Public Works Committee Meeting.
