NOTES:

- A. HUD may provide bonus funds, estimated at up to \$130,110 for FFY2019, within one or more program areas.
- B. The City may contract with Continuum of Care member agencies for additional funded activities, subject to approval of the Commission on Ending Homelessness. The list of Continuum of Care member agencies is shown in Exhibit B.

***Explanation of Program Types:**

- 1. Rapid Re-Housing is short-term financial assistance for rent, utilities and moving costs, accompanied by case management. Participants must be homeless.
- 2. Permanent Supportive Housing is long-term rental assistance, accompanied by supportive services. Participants must be homeless and disabled.
- 3. The Community Intake Center provides intake and assessment services to all agencies to meet HUD's requirement for a coordinated entry system.
- 4. Agencies receiving HUD Continuum of Care funding must participate in the Homeless Management Information System, or for domestic violence agencies, a comparable database.
- 5. HUD provides planning grants for costs of project evaluation, monitoring, system improvements, participation in Consolidated Planning activities, training, HUD compliance activities, preparing the grant application and similar costs related to development and improvement of the Continuum of Care system.
