**RESOLUTION APPROVING A CONTRACT CHANGE ORDER TO OLSEN GROUP, LTD. FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF RECOMMENDED TRAINING AND EXERCISES RELATED TO THE COMPLEX COORDINATED TERRORISM ATTACKS GRANT**

**WHEREAS,** The City of Winston-Salem was authorized to accept The Department of Homeland Security Fiscal Year 2016 Program to Prepare Communities for a Complex Coordinated Terrorist Attacks (CCTA Program) to provide funding to local, state, tribal and territorial jurisdictions of different types, sizes, and capabilities to improve their ability to prepare for, prevent, and respond to complex coordinated terrorist attacks, in collaboration with the whole community on August 21, 2017; and

**WHEREAS,** the CCTA Program funds are available to hire a consultant to provide services managing the grant and the training components; and

**WHEREAS,** a gap analysis and capabilities assessment has been conducted and recommendations on training and exercised have been established; and

**WHEREAS,** in order to meet the grant timelines and accomplish the identified training and exercises in accordance with the grant requirements, staff recommends allotting the related grant funds to Olson Group Ltd. for execution of the same; and

**WHEREAS,** the Olson Group, Ltd. is expected to deliver comprehensive services focused on identifying regional emergency preparedness gaps, updating emergency operations plans, exercising the updated plans and facilitating the identification and execution of training opportunities for Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Office of Emergency Management.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem that the City Manager and City Secretary are authorized to execute a contract change order with Olson Group, Ltd. in the amount of \$1,742,050 to provide regional, multi-agency training, planning and exercises as they are related to activities funded under the Fiscal Year 2016 Program to Prepare Communities for Complex Coordinated Terrorist Attacks grant.
