Summary of Information

In September 2022, the City Council authorized a grant of \$100,000 to the Film Partnership of North Carolina (FPNC) to administer a new and specific training program for the film/television production workforce in Winston-Salem and the region. The FPNC's plan was to use the City's funds to provide on-the-job training for interns for an average of five weeks, with a focus on historically underserved communities. Under their agreement with the City, they had three years to spend the funds and provide a report to the City on the outcomes achieved. Funding for the City's grant was provided from economic development project fund reserves.

FPNC leadership recently provided City management with a report on the use of the \$100,000 grant. Please see the attached narrative report and infographic, which highlight the number of interns placed, productions supported, direct spend, and local partners.

Recent productions, including *A Little Prayer* and *The Bard*, hired most of the interns funded through the City's assistance. A third feature film production—*Widow*—is scheduled to begin filming this October. FPNC officials anticipate this production will employ another 25 interns from Forsyth County.

FPNC officials have requested an additional \$100,000 for FY 2025-2026 to continue the intern program and local training efforts. In addition, they would like for City officials to consider continued funding in the FY 2026-2027 budget cycle.

The Film Partnership of North Carolina has requested an additional \$100,000 in City grant funds to continue the intern program and serve the needs for upcoming productions in Winston-Salem and the Triad.
