diminish the rights of all; and

WHEREAS: Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, set forth a

national policy of fair housing without regard to race, color, nationality,

religion, gender, familial status, or disability; and

WHEREAS: The Winston-Salem Human Relations Commission is charged with

enforcing the local fair housing ordinance; and

WHEREAS: The Winston-Salem Human Relations Commission promotes the belief

that equal housing is an important component of our diverse

community; and

WHEREAS: Ongoing education, outreach, and monitoring are key to raising

awareness of fair housing principles, practices, rights, and

responsibilities; and

WHEREAS: The City of Winston-Salem fully supports the intents and purposes of

the Federal Fair Housing Act, and in 1982, adopted the Fair Housing Ordinance and its revision in 1990 to include the two new protected

classes of handicapped and families with children.
