

The College Advisory Board Apprenticeship Program Fact Sheet

What is the purpose of the CAB Apprenticeship Program?

The purpose of the CAB Apprenticeship Program is to offer CAB students direct insights on how they can consider careers in municipal government with the City of Winston-Salem, thereby serving as a valuable recruitment tool. The program is also a pathway for CAB undergraduate and graduate students to learn more about the operations and effectiveness of municipal government.

To provide our College Advisory Board members an opportunity for hands-on learning and job-related training in an area of interest within the City's local government departments.

How will the program function with city departments?

The program will match CAB students to relevant city departments for a hands-on opportunity to work in key city departments. CAB members will request which subject-matter areas that are of interest to them as potential future professional areas. Specific project areas will be determined by the respective departments.

What is the expected duration of the CAB apprenticeship?

The requested duration of the CAB apprenticeship opportunity is three -to-six weeks. Upon completion of their apprenticeship, CAB members will present a report of their learning experience during the May City Council meeting.
