## **Summary of Information:**

On May 16, 2019 the City of Winston-Salem received a petition from Fishel Road Partners for the voluntary annexation of approximately 30.613 acres located off of Fishel Road being part of The Grove at Fishel Road. On September 16, 2019, this annexation became effective as it was approved by the Winston-Salem City Council. Based on information from the Forsyth County Tax Assessor, the net real property value for the area in the Griffith Fire Tax District is \$227,800, which represents 0.12151178% of the total 2019 taxable value of the Griffith Fire District of \$187,471,543.

In accordance with N.C.G.S 160A-31.1, the City must pay annually a proportionate share of any payments due on any debt (including principal and interest) relating to facilities or equipment of the rural fire department impacted by the annexation. The City's recommended total debt payments for fiscal years 2019-20 through 2021-22 are \$151.24, with a present value of \$147.91 Griffith Volunteer Fire Department has agreed to a lump sum payment at the present value.
