

ARPA-ENABLED FRAMEWORK + TRANSFORMATIONAL GRANTS

August 14, 2023

BACKGROUND

The City of Winston-Salem received a total of \$51.7 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery (CLFRF) Funding. In January 2023, the City Council approved taking the Treasury allowed "Revenue Replacement" method, which was calculated to be about \$49 million. Doing so, enabled the City to more effectively partner with non-profit agencies and City departments (without as heavy of federal compliance burden).

This presentation overviews the ARPA-enabled framework, and more thoroughly provides Transformational Grant updates.





PROJECT UPDATES



- 7 buildings have opened back up with 2 additional buildings by mid-August.
- In May 2023, attendance was 3,595 or 57% of May 2019. On track to increase # of visitors in school tours & paid attendance.
- Able to maintain steady & consistent hours for the Historic District of 10a.m.-4 p.m. Wed-Sat.



- Providing summer enrichment camps for students pre-k – 6th grade for students with exceptional needs.
- Summer programs wrapped up in July.
- Will provide before and afterschool care, and an inclusion program in the fall.



- Discovery phase nearly complete (demographics data and other designs).
- Que Pasa featured the Proyecto Mariposa work on the front page.
- Launched Instagram and Facebook platforms – 95 posts published to date. (Part of discovery phase.)

PROJECT UPDATES



- Trained/Re-trained 52 individuals who are blind or visually impaired on various new equipment and tasks.
- Hired trainers to prepare and improve the work environment.



- Hosted a Sustainability
 Roundtable in May 2023 and has begun preparations for the fall Sustainability Roundtable.
- As of July 2023, hosted 6
 additional events to engage
 community in environmental
 sustainability.
- Launched 3 out of the 5 new initiatives to address sustainability and economic vitality.

- Internal and external studentfacing dashboards created.
- Incorporated a language access portal to assist with language barriers.
- Training parents and students on the portal.

PROJECT UPDATES



Delayed

- Challenges entering into lease agreement between SouthEast Plaza Shopping Center.
- Still pending documentation from UHC (insurance, finalized budget, performance metrics, etc.).
- Contract not yet completed as of the end of July 2023.

SUMMARY

Of the \$51.7 million in the ARPA-Enabled Framework, \$16.9 million has been expended/disbursed.

Of the 15 ARPA-Enabled Transformational Grantees, only one contract has not been executed. All other Transformational Grant agreements are executed, with the majority of projects underway.
