OFFICE OF THE MAYOR

- WHEREAS:** National Hunger & Homeless Awareness Week is held each year the week before Thanksgiving in an effort to increase community activities highlighting the issues of hunger and homelessness; and
- WHEREAS:** The Bethesda Center for the Homeless was founded in 1989 to meet a growing community need for emergency shelter for the homeless and works 365 days a year to make a difference in the lives of those it serves; and
- WHEREAS:** The Bethesda Center has expanded its work to include supportive services to assist homeless women and men in the community work toward self-sufficiency; and
- WHEREAS:** from 2017 – 2018 the Bethesda Center has had a positive impact on decreasing the number of homeless in the Winston-Salem community by providing emergency night shelter and day shelter services to 878 citizens of Winston-Salem and by helping 113 men and women successfully transition into permanent housing; and
- WHEREAS:** The Bethesda Center has created a series of week-long events as part of National Hunger & Homeless Awareness Week that will honor individuals and organizations that support the Center's work, as well as provide opportunities for the community to be involved in its efforts.
