Ordinance Approving an Amendment to Chapter 2, Article III of the City Code Adding Division 18 to Codify the By-Laws of the Community Sustainability Program Committee.

## **Summary of Information:**

In May of 2007, City Council adopted a resolution pledging the City of Winston-Salem's commitment to stabilizing atmospheric concentrations of greenhouse gases by reducing emissions from its local government operations and throughout the community. In September 2008, City Council established the Community Sustainability Program Committee, responsible for reviewing the City's Local Action Plan and providing periodic reports and recommendations to City Council with regard to greenhouse gas emissions and related sustainability issues. The committee dissolved in 2013 when a grant from the Energy Efficiency Community Block Grant expired. In September of 2018, the City re-established the Community Sustainability Program Committee (CSPC) through resolution.

Remarks:				

Since the CSPC was re-established by resolution, its by-laws are not currently in the City's Code of Ordinances. If approved, the attached language would codify the Committee's structure. This includes establishment of a quorum, election of a vice chair, establishment of the Committee's ability to set its meeting schedule, and reversion back to the 2008 Committee appointment process being citywide. The proposed by-laws follow the intent of the resolution, including its outline for duties and number of members. It modifies membership appointment in order to increase recruitment and membership. It also allows the committee to elect its own chair and vice chair, and establish its meeting schedule, whether it be monthly or quarterly.

The Ordinance (2-310.22) replaces the 2018 Sustainability resolution.
