


Requirements

- Program designed for at risk populations 18-24 years old
- Resides in Winston-Salem, NC
- Youth/Adult offender
- Low income
- Incarcerated guardian/caregiver
- Current/former foster youth
- Must pass city background
 Lift 25 pounds









THE COMPONENTS



Market the program to atrisk populations via social media, community partners, WSPD/Sherriff's Office, DSS, local libraries, WSFCS, and local recreation centers, and news media.

Career Preparation

During the first 60 days, apprentices learn, demonstrate, and practice personal responsibility skills, job search strategies, computer fluency, and create and commit to a personal career development plan.


Career Development

Apprentices graduate from the program and receive six months of monthly contact from staff, and possible follow-up services and incentives.
