**Summary of Information:**

The attached Resolution and Ordinance authorize the City Manager to execute necessary agreements to receive a Directed Financial Assistance Award of \$500,000 in federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Funds (authorized in section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act [P.L. 117-2] and appropriated by S.L. 2021-180 as amended by S.L. 2021-189) for the hospital-based violence intervention grant, and amends the expenditure appropriations for the Special Revenue Funds of the Project Budget Ordinance for the Fiscal Year 2021-2022 to appropriate \$500,000 for this purpose.

The State Fiscal Recovery Fund, as a component of the American Rescue Plan Act, appropriated \$500,000 in support of the COVID-19 recovery project for Hospital-based Violence Intervention. Through community partnerships, and specific partnership with Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist, funding for this project proposes to implement a system of care that will enhance hospital and community-based support services, by providing holistic, culturally relevant, trauma-informed care and support for youth and adult victims of

interpersonal violence, their families, and the community as a measure to reduce hospital recidivism and improve overall victim outcomes and quality of life.

The City of Winston-Salem will receive and disburse funds for direct and indirect project expenditures incurred prior to December 31, 2024. The initial funding request is projected to begin July 1, 2022, and funds will be requested quarterly throughout the project. The project timeline is currently expected to extend through March, 2024. Reporting requirements and project activities monitoring will be managed by City staff in cooperation with Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist.
