**RESOLUTION AWARDING CONTRACT RENEWAL
FOR SIDEWALK CUTTING REPAIRS**

WHEREAS, the Field Operations Department desires to eliminate trip hazards on city sidewalks and a new method of repair is available that is effective and causes less environmental impact compared to standard grinding; and

WHEREAS, after proper advertisement, proposals were received by City/County Purchasing at 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 25, 2023, for sidewalk cutting repairs and one proposal was received from Precision Safe Sidewalks, LLC (Arlington, VA); and

WHEREAS, Precision Safe Sidewalks, LLC met all criteria of the bid specifications and was awarded an initial contract of \$90,000 as authorized by the City Manager, and the contractor exceeded all expectations in performing the work; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends that the contract be renewed with Precision Safe Sidewalks, LLC, for sidewalk cutting repairs from the date of purchase order through December 6, 2024, in the not-to-exceed annual amount of \$180,000, with the option to extend the contract for one additional annual period (until December 6, 2025), if both parties agree and funds are made available for that purpose, making the total possible award amount over three years to be the estimated amount of \$450,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, upon approval by the Finance Committee, that the contract extension for sidewalk cutting repairs is hereby awarded to Precision Safe Sidewalks, LLC, from date of purchase order through December 7, 2024, in the not-to-exceed annual amount of \$180,000, with the option to extend the contract for one additional annual period until December 6, 2025, making

the total possible award amount over three years to be the not-to-exceed amount of \$450,000. The City Manager and City Clerk are authorized to execute the contract on behalf of the City, with contract to be approved by the City Attorney.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the award of this contract constitutes a preliminary determination as to the qualifications of the bidder. The City is not legally bound to perform the contract until the contract is duly executed by the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that funding has been appropriated in the approved FY 2023-24 budget to cover the cost of this contract, with renewals thereafter subject to future budget appropriations.
