Summary of Information:

In the Fall of 2020, the Mayor and City Council allocated \$1 million to invest in social justice and anti-poverty initiatives. The Community Investments Review Committee (CIRC), appointed by the Mayor and City Council via a resolution during the adoption of the FY 2021-22 budget, created the following categories for the \$1 million as part of the first phase of the process:

The categories are:

- 1) Grants for Social Justice/Anti-poverty Initiatives (\$200,000)
- 2) Long-term Anti-poverty/Social Justice Strategies (\$200,000)
- 3) Broadband Internet Access Expansion and Training (\$300,000)
- 4) Heritage Preservation and Education (\$190,000)
- 5) Mentorship and Neighborhood Capacity Building (\$110,000)

As part of phase 2 of the process, applications were made available in December of 2020 for non-profit organizations to apply for the community investments grants in four of the five funding categories established by the CIRC. Applications were due on January 15, 2021. The Broadband Internet Access Expansion category will be managed in-house.
