Summary of Information

On February 17, 2020, the Mayor and City Council approved an original amount of \$275,000 for the Forsyth County DRIVE Program, which is a driver's license restoration program administered by the District Attorney's Office. Original funding for the program was provided from a fund balance appropriation. Since the original funding mechanism, the City has twice provided additional funding, both from one-time resources, fund balance and the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

The period of performance for the current agreement is through December 31, 2025. The attached resolution authorizes an extension to the period of performance through November 30, 2026. It is anticipated that the current funding will allow the program to operate through November of next year using funding already appropriated by City Council. Not additional funding has been provided to the program beyond this period.

Analysis of Fiscal Impact

The execution of an amendment to the current agreement will have no fiscal impact as the funding for the extension is already appropriated. No additional funding has been provided for recurring expense beyond November 2026.
