RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPROVE THE FISCAL YEAR 2017 FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION FORMULA PROGRAM SECTION 5307 FUNDING ALLOCATION SPLIT LETTER FOR THE PIEDMONT AUTHORITY FOR REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307 funds are appropriated to urban areas with more than 200,000 in population and is used for operating and capital assistance; and

WHEREAS, the Winston-Salem's Urban area receives a full appropriation of the FTA, Section 5307 funding in the amount of \$4,233,716 for FY 2017; and

WHEREAS, this change order includes construction administration and project observation services for the additional 8 month period added to the construction contract; and

WHEREAS, the City of Winston-Salem is the designated recipient of this funding for the Winston-Salem Urban area; and

WHEREAS, On July 20, 2017, the Winston-Salem Urban Area Transportation Advisory Committee approved the 2017 apportionment to the 3 eligible sub-recipients and JARC agencies for funding: the Winston-Salem Transit Authority receives \$3,594,152, the Piedmont Authority for Regional Transportation (PART) receives \$415,289, Davidson County Transportation receives \$169,275 and JARC agencies receive \$55,000; and

WHEREAS, as a current direct recipient of FTA funding, PART is eligible to apply directly to FTA for their portion of the Section 5307 funds if the City of Winston-Salem issues a sub-allocation or 'split letter'; and

WHEREAS, the sub-allocation letter indicates to FTA that the direct recipient, PART, will apply for the funding separately and also releases oversight responsibilities of fund administration from the designated recipient, or City of Winston-Salem'; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends issuing a split letter to PART for FY 2017, Section 5307

funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Winston-Salem hereby authorize the City Manager and City Secretary to execute a suballocation letter with PART for FY 2017, Section 5307 funds totaling \$415,289.
