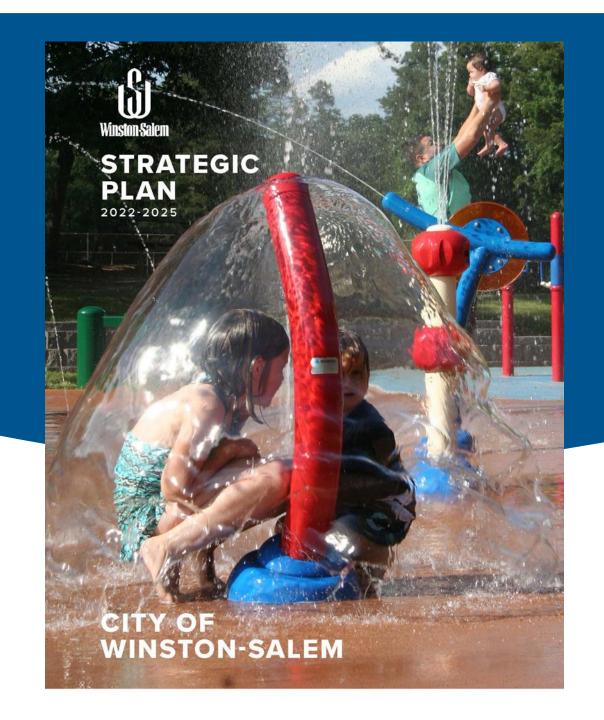

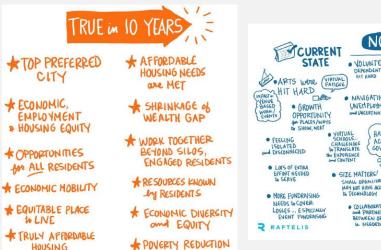

#### **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

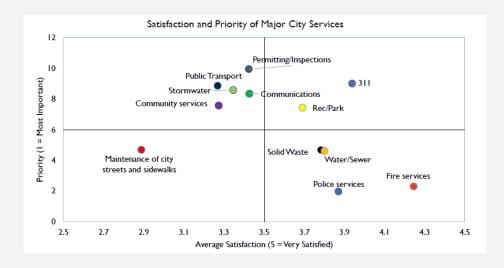
- 5 focus groups led by The Novak Consulting Group

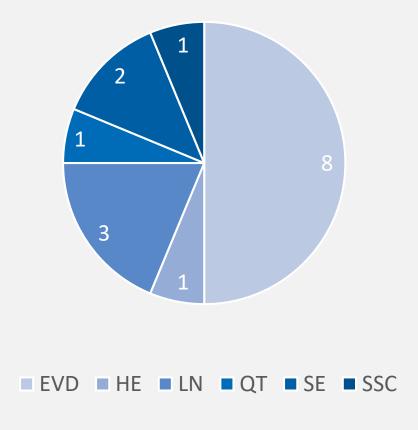
