## RESOLUTION AWARDING PURCHASE ORDER FOR THREE BATTERY ELECTRIC PICKUP TRUCKS

**WHEREAS**, battery electric pickup trucks are available in a 2024 half-ton compact model, and the Field Operations Department is requesting to purchase three half-ton pickup trucks as replacements for vehicles that have exceeded fleet replacement criteria; and

**WHEREAS**, the North Carolina Sheriff's Association (N.C.S.A), a cooperative purchasing group program, awarded competitive contract #022-08-0913RR passenger vehicles per bid specifications to Parks Ford, who has offered quotation #0226202403 for three 2024 Ford F-150 Lightning battery electric pickup trucks at a total price of \$150,675.18 after discounts; and

**WHEREAS,** it is recommended that a purchase order be awarded to Parks Ford for three 2024 Ford F-150 Lightning battery electric pickup trucks under the terms of N.C.S.A. contract #022-08-0913RR.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem, upon approval by the Finance Committee, that the purchase order is hereby awarded to Parks Ford for three 2024 Ford F-150 Lightning battery electric pickup trucks for the total price of \$150.675.18. This award is in accordance with N.C.G.S. 143-129(e)(3), an exception to formal bidding which authorizes "purchases made through a competitive bidding group purchasing program, which is a formally organized program that offers competitively obtained purchasing products and services at discount prices to two or more public agencies".

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this purchase is included in the FY 2023-24 capital equipment budget and will be financed through the City's internal leasing program.
