

TRANSFORMATIONAL GRANTS OVERVIEW

- 89 Applications Received
- Requests totaled \$50.7 million
 - Capital Requests = \$19.7 million
 - Operating Requests = \$31.0 million
- Survey results excludes housing/homelessness applications
 - 47 applications
 - \$34.7 million

Scope of Work

YMCA REACH Center

Capital

- Renovations to create a facility for programs such as literacy, career education, health interventions, and youth development
- The Salvation Army Teen Center

Capital/Operating

- Renovations of the current facility to create a teen center to provide a better space for programs including workforce readiness, health/lifestyle education, financial management, and more
- Boston-Thurmond United Initiative

Capital/Operating

Support for initiatives including early learning, housing/commercial development feasibility study, purchase/upfit of administrative/operations building, college clinic, and more

Scope of Work

Arts Council There's No Place Like Home

Operating/(Capital)

- Financial support for the National League of Cities 'One Nation One Project' initiative to improve community health and resilience through the arts
- Old Salem Reopen Our Doors

Operating

Support to increase staffing and hours of operation

TRANSFORMATIONAL GRANTS ONGOING DISCUSSIONS

Eligibility Issues

- New capital projects for non-profit organizations
 - Statutory authority only for construction related to arts, museums, affordable housing
 - Renovation/rehabilitation of properties to be used for services provided to low-to-moderate income individuals or households would be eligible - NCGS 160D-1311(a)(1)
- Economic development programming criteria
 - Generally, economic development is not ARPA eligible
 - On a case-by-case basis, certain workforce development or business support programs may be eligible
 - May require re-scoping submitted applications

NEXT STEPS

- Round I of Grants
 - Finalize the scopes of work
 - Execute contract(s) dates will vary based on complexity
- Future Round(s) of Grants
 - Continue discussions with City Council Members
 - Bring forward recommendations (December/January)
