## RESOLUTION APPROVING NAMING OF COMMUNITY GARDEN AT CARL H. RUSSELL RECREATON CENTER "PARMON PLANTS FOR PROSPERITY" IN HONOR OF THE LATE MRS. EARLINE PARMON

WHEREAS, The Recreation and Parks Commission, at its October 6, 2020 meeting received a request from Council Member John C. Larson, South Ward to name the community garden to be planted at Carl H. Russell Recreation Center "Parmon Plants for Prosperity" in honor of the late Mrs. Earline Parmon; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Earline Parmon was a longtime advocate for the Northeast Ward and the City of Winston-Salem as a whole; and

WHEREAS, she was the first black senator to represent Forsyth County; and

WHEREAS, she was elected to represent N.C. Senate District 32 in 2012; and

**WHEREAS,** she had previously served five terms representing District 72 in the N.C. House and spent 12 years as a Forsyth County commissioner; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Parmon was an outspoken crusader for her constituents, including funding for education; and

WHEREAS, She was a champion for the disadvantaged; and

**WHEREAS,** her devotion to education and community was embodied in a scholarship fund established in 2008 as a way to inspire young people to complete their college education; and

WHEREAS, the nonprofit served as a catalyst for affecting change throughout the communities she served; and

WHEREAS, during her time in the General Assembly, Mrs. Parmon championed a number of bills, including payments for victims of the state's eugenics program and the Racial Justice Act, which allowed defendants on death row to challenge their sentences if they could

prove that race was a significant factor in decisions to seek or impose the death penalty at the time of their trials; and

WHEREAS, her legacy also includes get out to vote efforts among city residents; and WHEREAS, as required by the City Council adopted policy on naming of City-owned buildings and facilities, the advisory body overseeing the facility, in this case the Recreation and
