

**RESOLUTION AWARDING PURCHASE ORDERS FOR  
AUTO AND TRUCK TIRES**

**WHEREAS**, the Winston-Salem Fleet Department and Fire Department has regular needs to purchase auto and truck tires; and

**WHEREAS**, after receiving bids, the State of North Carolina awarded term contract 863A for auto and truck tires and Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company, Parrish Tire Company, Inc., Mock Tire & Automotive, Inc., and Snider Tire Company (all Winston-Salem businesses) were selected as authorized to provide vehicle tires at state contract pricing; and

**WHEREAS**, N.C.G.S 143-129(e)(9): "The [bidding] requirements of this article do not apply to...Purchases from contracts established by the State or any agency of the State, if the contractor is willing to extend to a political subdivision of the State the same or more favorable prices, terms, or conditions as established in the State Contract."; and

**WHEREAS**, it is recommended to award purchase orders for auto and truck tires from the period of July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019, to Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company in the estimated amount of \$120,000, Parrish Tire Company, Inc. in the estimated amount of \$210,000, Mock Tire & Automotive, Inc. in the estimated amount of \$45,000, and Snider Tire Company in the estimated amount of \$175,000, under and in accordance with the North Carolina State Contract.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem that purchase orders for auto and truck tires from the period of July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019, are hereby awarded to Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company in the estimated amount of \$120,000, Parrish Tire Company, Inc. in the estimated amount of \$210,000, Mock Tire & Automotive, Inc. in the estimated amount of \$45,000, and Snider Tire Company in the estimated amount of \$175,000, under and in accordance with the North Carolina State Contract.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the award of these purchase orders constitutes a preliminary determination as to the qualification of the bidder. The City is not legally bound to perform the contract until the order is duly executed by the City.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that funds will be appropriated in the fiscal year 2017-18 budget and available in various accounts to cover the cost of these purchase orders.
