North Carolina **Strategic Focus Area:** Service Excellence Strategic Objective: Maintain City's Financial Strength Strategic Plan Action Item: No Kev Work Item: No **Summary of Information:** The proposed amendments to the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 budget ordinances authorize adjustments for the following purposes. **Appropriation of Grants and Other Revenues Received** □ The Community Development Department has received \$208,687 in Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds from the State of North Carolina to provide operating support to emergency shelters and assistance for extremely low-income individuals and families who are homeless. The Mayor and City Council approved submission of the

application, including grant allocations to agencies, in June 2019. The proposed amendment appropriates the \$208,687 in ESG funds and awards them to the agencies and in the amounts designated by the State.

- The proposed amendment appropriates \$20,300 in contributions and sponsorships for four Human Relations Department events. New sponsorships include \$2,700 for the Gentrification Symposium, \$2,600 for Building Integrated Communities, and \$12,000 for the Youth Advisory Council Summit. International Village received \$3,000 more in contributions and sponsorships than what was originally budgeted. Sponsorship funds are used to help cover costs of the event for which they are received.
- □ The proposed amendment appropriates \$51,280 in contributions from businesses and individuals received during the fiscal year to support the Recreation and Parks Department's programs and centers.

## **Downtown Ballpark Capital Maintenance**

□ Under the City's stadium lease agreement with the Winston-Salem Dash, the City, as the landlord, is responsible for all repairs and replacements necessary to maintain BB&T Ballpark in good condition and in compliance with Minor League Baseball Facility Standards. The City is not responsible for routine maintenance, housekeeping, landscaping, and repair of revenue-generating assets such as the scoreboard. The proposed amendment transfers \$148,500 from a debt reserve fund, which was established under the previous lease agreement, to the Ballpark capital fund to enable the City to meet its landlord obligations under the lease.

## **Fire Department Ballistic Vests**

□ In January 2020, the Mayor and City Council approved a resolution awarding a purchase order for ballistic protective vests and helmets for the Winston-Salem Fire Department. The purchase includes 144 vests and helmets at a cost of \$787 per set for a total amount of \$113,328. In August 2019, \$98,000 in grant and local matching funds was appropriated for this equipment. The proposed amendment transfers an additional \$15,330 from the Fire Department operating budget to the grants fund to complete the purchase.
