

# 2023 Downtown Plan



## Background

- The current Downtown Plan was adopted by City Council in April 2013.
- Similar to the current plan, the 2023 Plan will cover a 10-year timeframe.
- Downtown Winston-Salem Partnership lead the planning process with assistance from Planning and Development Services staff.



# Planning Process

- The process was led by the Planning Committee of the Downtown Winston-Salem Partnership.
  - 3 Subcommittees
- Outreach
  - Community leader interviews
  - 2 public surveys
    - 1,700 responses
  - 3 public workshops
    - 2 in-person and 1 virtual
  - Community group presentations
  - Subcommittee meetings

## Connectivity


- Improve parking
