RESOLUTION AGAINST GUN VIOLENCE IN THE CITY OF WINSTON-SALEM

WHEREAS, the City of Winston-Salem's vision is to be a municipal government

deserving of public confidence that provides excellent and innovative services, and is an active

and cooperative partner in creating a vital community; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the City of Winston-Salem is to provide quality, affordable

services that ensure the health, safety, and well-being of citizens, while collaborating throughout

the community to ensure its economic, social, and environmental vitality; and

WHEREAS, a major strategic focus area is safe and secure community of which Public

safety is the foundation upon which any successful city is built. Absent this, it is difficult to

attract businesses, residents, or visitors, which in turn create the economic vitality that sustains

our community; and

WHEREAS, gun violence continues to be a challenge across Winston-Salem; and

WHEREAS, firearm offenses not only include homicides and assaults against people,

but also includes houses, apartments, and vehicles being shot into; and

WHEREAS, the Winston-Salem Police Department (WSPD) has deployed a Team of

specialized personnel for quick response to shooting events, who upon crime scene arrival are

securing the crime scene and evidence, as well as interviewing potential witnesses and following

investigative leads; and

WHEREAS, the Winston-Salem Police Department requests our residents to directly

contact WSPD or Crimestoppers and provide information, descriptions (both of people and/or

vehicles) or other investigative leads; and

WHEREAS, a high number of juveniles are armed and are committing firearm offenses and are not being held in "secure custody," but are being released to parents/guardians and recommitting firearm offenses; and

WHEREAS, WSPD Executive Command spoke with Judges, the District Attorney's Office, Elected Officials, Juvenile Intake Counselors, and the Department of Social Services to raise awareness of the concern with releasing armed juveniles; and

WHEREAS, WSPD is on track to seize over 1000 firearms again in 2020, and All WSPD divisions/units are focused on gun crimes in an effort to reduce this issue (Patrol Division, Criminal Investigations Division, Special Investigations Division, Violent Firearms Investigation Team (VFIT), Gang Unit, K-9, SWAT, Traffic Enforcement Unit, Park Rangers, DWI Task Force, Forensic Services Division, Evidence Management, Crime Analysis Unit, Public Safety Communications, Records Division, etc.)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Winston-Salem support the WSPD to utilize all laws and resources, including collaborations with the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office, as well as state and federal resources to reduce gun violence in our communities.
