A Pilot for Coverage Services


# **웹 ₩\$7A** MicroTransit Zones

- Will bring any worker or resident within the zone to any WSTA or PART bus stop within the Zone
- MicroTransit Zones are covering most of the areas where fixed route service is being recommended for elimination and no fixed route service is proposed to become part of a new route
- Pilot Status: limit total spending on MicroTransit to a specific dollar amount per budget year. <u>Targeting \$150,000 to \$175,000 maximum for year 1.</u>
- Probably cannot afford to do all zones. Consider relative need of residents.
- Expect MicroTransit to perform worse on per-hour basis than 80% 100% of fixed routes, but \*\*might\*\* save cost overall versus routes replaced

#### MicroTransit Zone 1: Shattalon & Polo


- Connects to 3 WSTA Routes
- 3.7 sq miles
- ~10,200 residents, 17% poverty
- ~1,500 jobs
- Kaleideum North Children's Museum



# ₩ WSTA

#### MicroTransit Zone 2: West Winston


- Connects to 2 WSTA Routes
- 5.9 sq miles
- ~11,000 residents, <u>6% poverty</u>
- ~10,000+ jobs



# 1 WSTA

#### MicroTransit Zone 3: Southeast Winston


- Connects to 4 WSTA Routes
- 6.1 sq miles
- ~9,400 residents, 30% poverty
- ~700 jobs





#### MicroTransit Zone 4: Kimwell Drive / Salem Creek Area

- Connects to 6 WSTA Routes
- 3.5 sq miles
- ~4,500 residents, 15% poverty
- ~12,100 jobs



# ₩ WSTA

#### MicroTransit Zone 5: Winston Lake YMCA Area

- Connects to 2 WSTA Routes
- 0.625 sq miles
- ~1,200 residents, 15% poverty
- ~100 jobs
