## **Summary of Information:**

The City Council recently adopted a Resolution endorsing the Winston-Salem Bicycle Master Plan and another Resolution establishing guidelines for the management of shared mobility devices. In addition, staff is set to begin work on the development of a Winston-Salem Pedestrian Master Plan and the design and construction of bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure improvements throughout the City. Interest in active transportation and recreation issues is very high and residents are taking an increasingly active role in support of further efforts to improve those transportation options. A Bicycle, Pedestrian and Active Mobility Advisory Committee is recommended to review plans, projects, policies and programs from the City, North Carolina Department of Transportation, private developers and other entities for consistency with city goals to improve and encourage multimodal transportation and advise City Council accordingly. The Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Active Mobility Advisory Committee would be composed of 11 members of the public to serve three-year staggered terms.
