- WHEREAS, Phi Omega Chapter has a strong history and presence in serving the community, state, nation, and internationally. During the Centennial Year under the leadership of President Evelyn P. Acree, Phi Omega collaborated with members of the Divine 9 organizations in sponsoring nine Community Service Impact Projects, and established an Endowed Scholarship/Community Grant Fund at the Winston-Salem Foundation.
