

WHEREAS: Winston-Salem is a growing city in a growing metropolitan area, and with

growth and development comes more outdoor lighting, and with increased

outdoor lighting comes increased light pollution; and

WHEREAS: Light pollution uses additional energy, increases our carbon footprint, and

has widespread and deleterious impacts on whole ecosystems including

fish, mammals, invertebrates, amphibians, and plants; and

WHEREAS: Each year, billions of migratory birds traverse great distances, guided by the

natural rhythms of the earth and sky; their journeys are essential to the health of our ecosystems, contributing to the diversity and vitality of our

environment; and

WHEREAS: Artificial lighting from buildings, streetlights, and other sources can

disorient and endanger these birds, leading to collisions, exhaustion, and increased mortality; studies have shown that the intensity and direction of artificial light disrupt migratory patterns and pose a significant threat to

avian populations; and

WHEREAS: The City of Winston-Salem Sustainability Department is working with the

Forsyth Audubon Society to increase public outreach during peak fall and spring bird migration season and engages residents, building owners, and managers in actions to reduce unnecessary overnight light to prevent birds

from being attracted to urban areas.
