BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the total award amount of 428,078.14 would be funded 80% or \$342,462.51 by Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5307 FTA-5307 Capital and Operating Grants and the Winston-Salem match of 20% or \$85,615.63 would be available in the WSTA fund.
