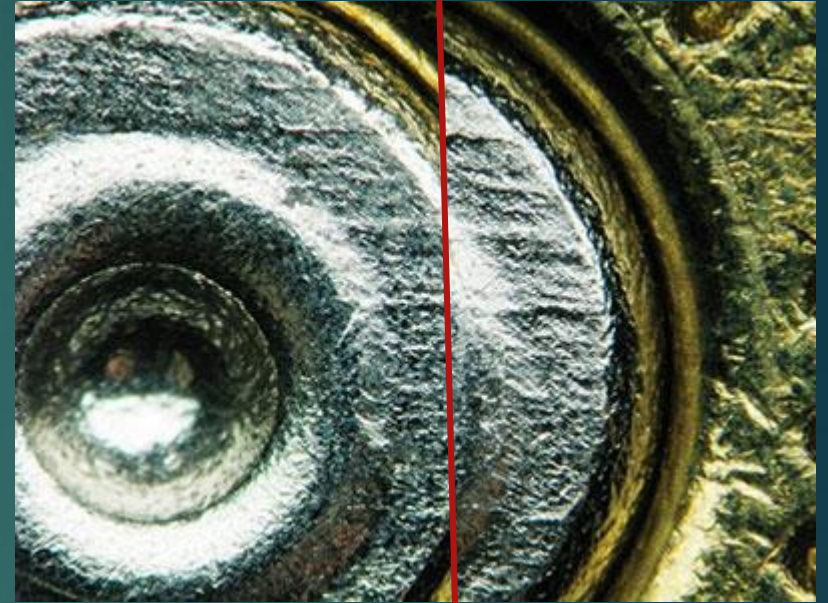

- 
- NIBIN- National Integrated Ballistic Information Network.
 - System created in 1999.
 - Managed by Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives.
 - Nearly 4 million pieces of evidence entered into the system

- When a firearm is discharged, it creates markings on the shell casing as unique as a fingerprint. NIBIN searches that ballistic fingerprint for a match.

- Links established can be: crime to crime, suspects to scenes, scenes to other scenes, and offenders to crimes.

- City of Winston-Salem purchased NIBIN terminal and BrassTrax/MatchPoint software - December 2017
 - Installation completed in May 2018
 - Our NIBIN Terminal went live May 2, 2018
 - Has already produced leads that were critical in generating arrests.

Statistics:

- 2018 – 1,550 packages of shell casings were seized which contained anywhere from 1 to dozens of casings.
- 2019 – 877 packages to date.

Statistics:

- To date, the WSPD NIBIN Terminal has completed approximately 1135 entries.
- To date, the WSPD NIBIN Terminal has yielded hundreds of leads. Many under current investigation.
- Currently, five WSPD personnel are NIBIN trained. Two more scheduled for June (FCSO personnel assigned to VFIT)
